

VICTORIAN





LEAN TO





Also sometimes known as an Edwardian - this style offers a great use of internal space due to the square or rectangular shape. It's a very classical style and compliments most house types.


GABLE



The ridge on this roof runs from the house to the front of the conservatory creating a tall, imposing gable-end front face.


A simple yet stylish conservatory design.

ADD A LITTLE EXTRA...



Adding the finishing touches to your new conservatory will make all the difference. Externally, you have the option to add a decorative Cornice which hides your guttering and rafter ends from view, completely transforming your roof-line and ensuring your conservatory roof makes the right visual impact. Choose from flat one, two or three tiers or you can opt for the more traditional curved finish.

Alternatively, there is the UrbanRoom Shroud which has a smoother, sleeker finish for a more contemporary look and is fabricated from aluminium.



Internally, add the insulated pelmet which sits around the perimeter of the room, giving the illusion of a flat roof with a lantern roof on top. This pelmet is also the perfect home for speakers & lighting.

Crestings and Finials are decorative in nature - and you'll be able to select from an extensive range to personalise your new conservatory. Our range comprises of four finials and five crestings so you'll be sure to find the one for you - alternatively keep it simple by not adding either.

Cornice



The decorative curved Cornice can fit on to any roof shape and can be added to any classic roof to give it a more traditional and elegant look. It can be used on 135° and 90° corners.

The flat Cornice looks modern and is fitted onto builds with right-angled corners. We can provide them in different sizes, so that they are in proportion with the scale of your conservatory - although all three of our flat cornices can be used on large or small builds. The flat decorative cornices are compatible with our Classic Roof, Livinroof, and Ultrasky Roof.





GLASS OPTIONS

There is an extensive range of glass options available for you to consider when choosing your new or next generation conservatory. We can offer a completely tailored solution whatever your colour preference, location or design of conservatory.

All our glazed roofs can be specified with glass that is toughened, double glazed, has market leading thermal performance, is self cleaning and solar controlled as standard. All these qualities are designed to keep you warm in winter and cool in summer. However, you can upgrade to other more advanced glass units if you wish and there are also other glass options for side frames, patios and bi-folding door glass which have properties to reduce bleaching of furniture and carpets caused by direct sunlight.

Choosing the correct glass means you get a better quality of light and thermal efficiency. Your conservatory will be warmer in winter, which means lower heating bills and you will be able to use the room for longer periods of time throughout the year. Furthermore, the roof will last longer in terms of overall life span and also add value to your home if you ever come to sell it.

Glazed roofs are not only much more thermally efficient but they are also a lot quieter than polycarbonate roofs. A glass roof offers 50% more noise reduction meaning it would be a lot quieter in weather such as rain & hail. They are also much easier to maintain - the self-cleaning glass has enhanced properties that encourage a chemical reaction that physically breaks down and washes away dirt. This requires a lot less maintenance and therefore allows your conservatory to look cleaner and brighter throughout the year.



measures heat loss through the unit. The lower the U value, the warmer the room will be in winter.



Light Transmittance

is the percentage of visible light that is able to pass through. The lower the light transmission, the lower the glare.



G Value

shows the percentage of the sun's heat that is able to pass through the unit. 40% G Value means 60% of the sun's heat is reflected back, reducing heat build up in summer months.



Warm Edge Technology

the use of a warm edge spacer bar between the two panes of glass is up to 950 times less conductive than aluminium, thereby increasing internal temperatures, vastly reducing condensation

The industry standard methods of measuring a glass units' effectiveness (how good it actually is) are explained on page 14, and a number of factors can influence the ideal specification of your glass. Some factors can include whether your conservatory is facing north or south, is in an exposed or sheltered location or you are overlooked by your neighbours. The choice of a colour tint or neutral clear is a personal decision, though typically the 'U' value will be in the region of 1 to 1.2 W/m²K, the 'G' value will range between 22% to 40% and the light transmission will range between 30% to 50%. We can provide a glass however that reflects 91% of the suns heat! We can also offer specialist glass solutions for specific or unique requirements. Remember to consider where your conservatory is situated in relation to the sun. A north facing conservatory many benefit from different side frame & roof glazing than that of a south facing conservatory.





YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

My conservatory is too hot in summer and too cold in winter, what is my best option for use all year round?



Do I need planning permission of Building Regulations approval?

Conservatories are normally exempt from building regulations when they meet a number of conditions. If you are refurbishing an existing one there shouldn't be any problems as you are improving the thermal properties. However, ask us about building regulations for more details.

How much will a conservatory refurbishment cost?

It all depends on a number of factors including size, style, design options and labour required. We can provide a free consultation assessing your current conservatory, then we will provide a quote based on your desires.

I want to refurbish my existing conservatory - will my old one have to be completely demolished?

More than likely no. It all depends on the condition of your current foundations and which system you are choosing to have installed. We will be able to provide you with the most honest and practical advice once a full inspection has been carried out.

If I am replacing my roof, how will my existing conservatory support a heavier roof?

A glazed roof is twice as heavy as a polycarbonate roof so the structural stability of your frames need to be taken into consideration. If you have old frames that won't offer substantial support, you will need to consider replacing them or have us install retro fit posts. These are installed on the inside of your conservatory and offer additional support to hold the weight.

Can I choose the colour of my new roof?

Absolutely! You can have your conservatory roof any colour you like! We can colour match too so if you see a paint colour you like, we can spray your roof to match. Why blend in when you can stand out? Make a statement (and your neighbours jealous!)

I don't have a conservatory, why should I add one?

A conservatory is one of the most popular home improvements allowing you to extend your space with an impressive new room. They are also a great investment - adding a conservatory could increase your home's value by at least 5%!

If I am refurbishing, is there an option to add new windows/doors?

Yes! There is never a better time to replace old windows and doors than when you're refurbishing the roof. As glazed roofs are twice as heavy as a polycarbonate roof it's often advised that new frames are installed to support your new roof. It also allows you to change the style of doors - i.e. add bi-folds or sliding doors to open up the room and make more use of your space.

Can I have an aluminium conservatory?
